





KEY ACHIEVEMENTS IN 2023

Expansion of TNVR Programs

LSTSI expanded its TNVR efforts into new regions including Yangon Myanmar, and Mae Taeng, Chaing Mai, Thailand. These expansions allowed us to train local veterinarians and volunteers, equipping them with the skills necessary to manage stray populations sustainably.

Community Engagement and Empowerment

One of our core principles is empowering local communities to manage their own stray populations. In this way we are sustainable and local communities learn to solve their own problems in their own backyard.

In 2023, we successfully trained several new local teams in safe animal handling, anesthesia, and sterilization techniques. This approach has ensured the sustainability of TNVR programs, with communities taking an active role in their success.

Financial Transparency and Sustainability

As a 100% volunteer-based organization, LSTSI has maintained its commitment to transparency and effective use of funds. The majority of our resources were allocated directly to our TNVR programs, with minimal administrative costs. This ensures that donor contributions are maximized to save as many lives as possible.

FINANCIAL **OVERVIEW**

In 2023, LSTSI received generous support from donors, which enabled us to fund our TNVR programs across various regions. The financial summary provides an overview of how these funds were allocated:

- * Program Expenses: 92% of funds were used directly for TNVR operations, including veterinary supplies, equipment, and training programs.
- * Administrative Costs: 3% of funds covered essential administrative expenses, ensuring the smooth operation of our programs.
- * Fundraising: 5% of funds were invested in fundraising activities, allowing us to broaden our donor base and secure future funding.



LOOKING **AHEAD**

As we move into 2024, LSTSI is committed to expanding its reach, with plans to initiate TNVR programs in additional communities within the countries we now serve. We will continue to prioritize community empowerment, sustainability, and transparency in all our operations. GENERAL TRIAS, CAVITE **PHILIPPINES**

In the Philippines, stray animal management often involves capturing animals and placing them in pounds where they are euthanized if unclaimed. This method is frequently triggered by human-animal conflicts and the abandonment of unwanted animals, contributing to a persistent stray population and rabies crisis.

Let's Save the Strays International (LSTSI) launched a targeted Trap-Neuter-Vaccinate-Release (TNVR) program in a small barangay in Cavite in 2019. In 2023, our program successfully sterilized and vaccinated approximately 120 animals, resulting in a significant reduction in stray animals and a decrease in community complaints. Since the program's inception, the local dog officer has not been required to remove any animals, highlighting the effectiveness of TNVR.

FUTURE PLANS

LSTSI has set ambitious goals to expand this initiative

Scaling Up TNVR

The organization plans to scale up the TNVR program to encompass the entire community, including approximately 5,000 dogs and cats in this subdivision alone, and over 20,000 in the Tres Generales area.

Hiring and Collaborating with Veterinarians

LSTSI will hire more veterinarians and engage with private practicing veterinarians to support the expanded effort, ensuring that the large number of animals can be effectively managed.

Memorandum of Understanding (MOU)

LSTSI is working on an MOU with the local municipality to prevent animals from being taken to pounds for euthanization, thereby promoting TNVR as the primary and more humane method of managing strays.

Community Engagement and Education

LSTSI will collaborate with local stakeholders to educate the public on the benefits of TNVR. This outreach will include monthly TNVR events designed to involve the community in humane animal management and to foster broader understanding and support for these efforts.

This comprehensive approach not only addresses the immediate issue of stray animal overpopulation but also works to create a sustainable, community-driven solution that can serve as a model for other regions. Through continued education and monthly TNVR events, LSTSI aims to ensure the long-term success of this initiative in Cavite.



MYANMAR

Myanmar has historically struggled with stray animal management, often resorting to mass poisoning with strychnine, a method that has not effectively controlled the country's severe rabies problem. Myanmar has the second-highest rabies infection rate in Asia, and with large stray populations, particularly in cities like Yangon, the need for effective intervention is critical.

Let's Save the Strays International (LSTSI) has been working in Myanmar, particularly focusing on Mandalay, since 2017. We promote Trap-Neuter-Vaccinate-Release (TNVR) as a humane and sustainable alternative to traditional stray population control methods. This approach not only reduces the number of strays but also helps control the spread of rabies through systematic sterilization and vaccination.

ACHIEVEMENTS IN 2023

Mandalay Focus

In 2023, LSTSI performed TNVR on nearly 4,000 animals, primarily dogs, with some cats included. This extensive effort has significantly impacted the local stray population in Mandalay, helping to reduce the number of animals on the streets and curb the spread of rabies.

Largest Project in Myanmar

LSTSI remains the only large-scale nonprofit conducting TNVR in Myanmar, establishing itself as the leading organization in the country's humane animal management efforts.

Expansion and Mentorship


Beyond Mandalay, LSTSI has begun expanding its TNVR program to Yangon, where a new veterinary team is being mentored by the seasoned Mandalay team. This ensures the continuation of high-quality care and effective TNVR practices.

Community Engagement

LSTSI's strong social media presence and local donor network have helped engage the Burmese community. The organization offers online education that promotes humane treatment of stray animals, leading to a shift in local attitudes and practices. This shift is evidenced by increasing requests from other communities in Myanmar to implement TNVR programs, demonstrating the wide embrace of LSTSI's method and the positive impact it's having across the country.

Grant Support

For the fourth consecutive year, LSTSI has received a sizable grant from Animals Australia, reinforcing the importance and effectiveness of its work in Myanmar.



FUTURE GOALS

Official Registration

LSTSI aims to become an officially registered nonprofit in Myanmar, which will enhance its ability to expand operations and continue making an impact.

Scaling Up in Yangon

With a large stray population in Yangon, LSTSI plans to scale up its efforts in the city, targeting the sterilization and vaccination of 200-300 animals per month.

Educational Outreach

LSTSI will continue to expand its educational initiatives, aiming to reach more people across Myanmar to promote humane and safe treatment of community animals. The organization is committed to changing long-standing practices and attitudes towards stray animal management through ongoing community engagement and public awareness campaigns.

MAE TAENG, CHIANG MAI, **THAILAND**

Mae Taeng, located in Northern Thailand, faces a severe overpopulation crisis with tens of thousands of stray animals, although no official count exists. The region lacks large-scale resources to manage this issue effectively, making it one of the most needy communities in Northern Thailand.

Starting in 2023, Let's Save the Strays International (LSTSI) has partnered with Hand to Paw, a Thai nonprofit organization, to address this critical situation through Trap-Neuter-Vaccinate-Release (TNVR) programs.

ACHIEVEMENTS

Collaboration with Local Teams

LSTSI works closely with local livestock veterinary teams to conduct large-scale TNVR events monthly. These events target both owned and stray animals, ensuring comprehensive coverage and reducing the overall stray population in the region.

Enhancement of Veterinary Capabilities

The local livestock veterinary teams initially lacked the proper equipment and medications needed to perform surgeries effectively using international standards. LSTSI has worked to improve this by purchasing sterile instruments, autoclaves, and other essential equipment, ensuring that each animal receives the highest standard of care and has a successful surgical outcome.

Disease Prevention

Although Mae Taeng has not experienced significant rabies cases, LSTSI proactively vaccinates animals against rabies and other infectious diseases. This preventative approach is essential in maintaining public health and preventing future outbreaks.

EDUCATIONAL INCENTIVES

A critical component of the Mae Taeng project is educating pet owners about the benefits of sterilization and vaccination. LSTSI is working to help owners understand that sterilization can prevent the challenges associated with unwanted litters, while vaccinations and preventive medications can protect their pets from common illnesses, such as those caused by ticks and mange, which are prevalent in Asia. This educational effort is aimed at encouraging responsible pet ownership and improving the overall health of both owned and stray animals in the community.

FUTURE GOALS

Expansion of TNVR Efforts:

LSTSI and Hand to Paw aim to increase the number of animals treated each month, with plans to scale up the TNVR program to address the vast stray population more effectively.

Growth of Veterinary Teams:

As part of the expansion efforts, LSTSI plans to grow the veterinary teams involved in the project. By recruiting and training more veterinary professionals, LSTSI will be able to handle a larger number of animals and ensure that the expanded TNVR operations maintain high standards of care.

Sustained TNVR Efforts: The goal remains to create a sustainable, long-term solution to the overpopulation crisis in Mae Taeng, with continued monthly TNVR events and broader community engagement.






The Tula region, located 2.5 hours outside Moscow, has long faced severe challenges in animal welfare. Before we began working in 2018, there was no organization consistently helping the stray animals in the area. Stray dogs were often forced to give birth on the freezing streets, where both pups and adult dogs were tragically found frozen to the pavement or snow. In the warmer months, these animals faced other dangers such as being shot, beaten, or hit by cars. The situation was dire, with hundreds of puppies found abandoned in garbage dumps, left to starve.



ACHIEVEMENTS IN **2023**

In 2023 alone, LSTSI performed TNVR on nearly 250 stray dogs in Tula. This intervention has drastically reduced the number of stray dogs in the area, contributing to a safer and more manageable community environment.

Local Collaboration

LSTSI has been working persistently with local veterinarians to conduct monthly TNVR operations. These efforts are carried out methodically, targeting one neighborhood at a time, street by street. This systematic approach is essential for maintaining the progress made and ensuring that the stray population remains under control.

Rehoming Efforts

In cases where stray animals could not survive on the streets due to injury, illness, or other factors, LSTSI, in partnership with Bi g Little Life Animal Rescue, has successfully rehomed them. Some of these animals have been relocated to Estonia and other EU nations, where they have found new homes and a better quality of life with local adopters.

FUTURE GOALS

Sustained TNVR Operations

LSTSI's primary goal is to continue the TNVR process in Tula, maintaining the momentum of monthly trapping and treatment operations. The organization aims to keep meticulous records of all animals treated to monitor the program's effectiveness and adapt strategies as needed.

Expansion of Rehoming Programs

LSTSI plans to continue its efforts to rehome animals that are not suited for life on the streets. By working with Big Little Life Animal Rescue and other partners, LSTSI will aim to expand these rehoming efforts, finding safe and loving homes for more animals in need.





LSTSI ASSISTS IN UKRAINE



The ongoing conflict in Ukraine has severely impacted both human and animal populations, leaving many animals abandoned, homeless, and in dire need of medical care. The war-torn regions have been particularly challenging for veterinarians and animal rescue efforts due to the lack of resources and support.


Let's Save the Strays International (LSTSI), in collaboration with the Massachusetts Veterinary Medical Association (MVMA) and K9 Global Rescue, has been instrumental in providing critical aid to veterinarians working in Ukraine. LSTSI has organized the collection and delivery of unused donated medications and veterinary supplies from the U.S. to support those on the front lines in Ukraine.

To date, LSTSI has donated over 500 pounds of essential supplies, including flea/tick/heartworm/intestinal dewormer medications, antibiotics, heartworm treatments, eye and ear medications, pain medications, bandage material, among the large list. These supplies have been vital in treating hundreds of animal refugees, helping them survive the harsh conditions brought on by the conflict.



CHIANG MAI, THAILAND

Let's Save the Strays International (LSTSI) has actively sponsored several TNVR (Trap-Neuter-Vaccinate-Release) projects in collaboration with Lanna Dog Welfare. In 2023, LSTSI sponsored TNVR initiatives that successfully treated over 100 dogs across various parts of Chiang Mai, contributing significantly to controlling the stray dog population in the region.
